Development of trans-European networks in the energy sector

1994/0010(SYN) - 29/05/1995 - Modified legislative proposal

The Commission's amended proposal incorporates four amendments adopted by the European Parliament on the following points: - the need to adopt a common energy strategy which meets the objectives of the Union, including objectives in relation to the liberalization of the energy market; - the fact that developing trans-European networks in the energy sector should help to reduce the cost of energy supplies and foster economic growth; - the need for feasibility studies to take account of the economic, social and technical aspects of projects; - the need for the Community to attach the greatest importance to technical cooperation between Member States. However, the Commission did not include amendments seeking to: - give priority during intervention under Community funds, instruments and financial programmes to energy networks which foster economic and social cohesion; - set up an advisory committee (type I) for the implementation of the measures, rather than the management committee proposed by the Commission.

Development of trans-European networks in the energy sector

1994/0010(SYN) - 19/01/1994 - Legislative proposal

The proposal for a Council decision sought to eliminate legal, technical, administrative and financial obstacles to the development of trans-European energy networks. To that end the Community needed to promote: - technical cooperation projects between operators responsible for the management, supervision and regulation of trans-European energy networks; - cooperation amongst Member States to simplify and speed up the procedures for authorising network projects and shorten the time frames for their completion; - definition of a common approach to the technical aspects of networks. Financial support was possible in the form of loan guarantees or interest subsidies for feasibility studies of projects of common interest or projects aimed at improving technical cooperation in the exploitation of trans-European energy networks.

Development of trans-European networks in the energy sector

1994/0010(SYN) - 28/03/1996 - Final act

OBJECTIVE: To remove the legal, technical, administrative and financial barriers to development of trans-European energy networks. **COMMUNITY MEASURE:** Council Decision laying down a series of measures aimed at creating a more favourable context for the development of trans-European networks in the energy sector. **SUBSTANCE:** The Decision identifies the action to be taken with a view to creating a more favourable context for the implementation of projects of common interest in connection with trans-energy networks and for the interoperability of such networks on a Community-wide scale. To this end, the Community intends to promote: - the implementation of technical cooperation projects between the operators responsible for the management, control and regulation of trans-European energy networks; - cooperation between Member States with a view to simplifying and speeding up the authorization procedures for network projects, in order to reduce delays. The Community may provide financial support in the form of loan guarantees or interest-rate subsidies in connection with feasibility studies into projects of common interest or projects designed to improve technical cooperation in the operation of trans-European energy networks. **ENTRY INTO FORCE:** 28/03/96

Development of trans-European networks in the energy sector

1994/0010(SYN) - 29/06/1995 - Council position

The Council's common position basically follows the approach taken by the Commission and Parliament on the basis of the amended proposal. The main amendments incorporated in the common position relate to the following points: - the need to adopt a common energy strategy which meets the objectives of the Union, including objectives in relation to the liberalization of the energy market; - the fact that developing trans-European networks in the energy sector should help to reduce the cost of energy supplies and foster growth, competitiveness and employment; - the conditions of eligibility of projects: when examining projects of common interest, feasibility studies should take account of economic, social and technical factors; - the need for the Community not just to promote but to attach the greatest importance to technical cooperation. The Council also included new provisions seeking to: - delete article 5 of the proposal on budgetary aspects; - simplify the reference to the Council regulation (defining the general rules for funding trans-European networks), which will form the legal basis for financial aid granted under the TEN policy; - introduce a type IIIa committee (regulatory committee).

Development of trans-European networks in the energy sector

1994/0010(SYN) - 18/05/1995 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

Adopting the report by Mr Gordon Adam, the European Parliament approved the Commission proposal. In its amendments, the European Parliament: - stressed that developing networks in the energy sector should help to reduce the cost of energy supplies and stimulate growth, competitiveness and employment; - called for priority to be given to trans-European energy networks which promote economic and social cohesion, taking account of economic, social and technical factors; - called for the Commission to be assisted by an advisory committee composed of representatives from the Member States and chaired by the Commission representative and for the Commission to take greater account of the opinion of the committee and any observations made by the European Parliament.

Development of trans-European networks in the energy sector

1994/0010(SYN) - 26/10/1995 - Text adopted by Parliament, 2nd reading

Adopting the recommendation for second reading by Mr ADAM (PSE, UK) on actions to create a more favourable context for the development of trans-European networks, the European Parliament approved the Council's common position with the following amendments: - it recommended that financial resources earmarked for the networks be used by the Community to support efforts undertaken by Member States in the form of aid for economic, social and technical feasibility studies and, where necessary, for loan guarantees or interest-rate subsidies; - it reiterated that priority should be given to trans-European energy networks which fostered economic and social cohesion, taking account of economic, social and technical factors; - finally, with regard to comitology, it called for provision to be made for an advisory committee.

The Commission accepted the common position, with the exception of the amendments relating to comitology, for which the Commission preferred a type IIa committee.
