Additional conditions for year-to-year management of TACs and quotas

1994/0303(CNS) - 22/04/1996

The Council succeeded in reaching unanimous agreement on the proposal for a regulation, on the basis of the presidency compromise. After some legal and linguistic editing, the text was to be adopted at the next meeting of the Council.

Additional conditions for year-to-year management of TACs and quotas

1994/0303(CNS) - 12/07/1995 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

In adopting the report by Mrs Patricia McKENNA (Greens, IRL) Parliament approved the regulation laying down additional rules for the year-to-year management of TACs and quotas. As it was in favour of introducing greater flexibility to the system, Parliament wanted to see Member States having until 30 September of each year to submit requests for permission to land additional quantities of stocks or to transfer to the following year quotas which have not been taken up (instead of 31 March as proposed by the Commission).

Additional conditions for year-to-year management of TACs and quotas

1994/0303(CNS) - 09/12/1994 - Legislative proposal

The Council's proposal for a regulation seeks to lay down conditions for the pursuit of exploitation activities in the fisheries sector which would improve the mechanisms currently available through the introduction of year-to-year flexibility in the management of total allowable catches (TACs) and quotas which, within certain limits, is compatible with the conservation measures. The Regulation mainly provides: - that the Council, when fixing TACs in accordance with Regulation (EEC) No 3760/92, decides which stocks shall be subject to an analytical or precautionary TAC; - for the Member States to be encouraged to transfer part of their quotas of stocks, which are subject to analytical TACs, from one year to another, with certain limits; - to put in place the necessary mechanisms to discourage overfishing with regard to precautionary TACs and to penalize overfishing in the case of analytical TACs.

Additional conditions for year-to-year management of TACs and quotas

1994/0303(CNS) - 06/05/1996 - Final act

OBJECTIVE: to lay down conditions for the pursuit of exploitation activities in the fisheries sector which would improve the mechanisms presently available through the introduction of a year-to-year flexibility in the management of total allowable catches (TACs) and quotas. COMMUNITY MEASURE: Council Regulation No 96/847/EC introducing additional conditions for the year-to-year management of total allowable catches and quotas. CONTENT: the Regulation provides: - that when fixing TACs in accordance with Regulation No 3760/92/EEC, the Council shall decide which stocks are subject to a precautionary TAC and which stocks are subject to an analytical TAC; - for the Member States to be encouraged to transfer part of their quotas of stock subject to analytical TACs from one year to another with certain limits. Up to 31 October of each year, states may submit requests for permission to land additional quantities of stocks or to transfer to the following year quotas that have not been taken up; - for the necessary mechanisms to be introduced to discourage overfishing with regard to precautionary TACs and to penalise overfishing in the case of analytical TACs.

1994/0303(CNS) - 06/05/1996

Following the political agreement reached at the sitting of the Fisheries Council on 22 April 1996, the Council unanimously adopted the regulation.

Additional conditions for year-to-year management of TACs and quotas

1994/0303(CNS) - 06/04/1995

Pending receipt of Parliament's opinion, the Council took stock of discussions on the proposal for a regulation introducing additional conditions for the year-to-year management of TACs and quotas. The purpose of the proposal, which comes under the multiannual management strategies framework, is to introduce a system that allows for year-to-year flexibility in the management of TACs by giving the Member States the possibility of transferring part of their stock quotas from one year to another. The Permanent Representatives Committee was instructed to continue its discussions on the basis of the Commission's replies to delegations' comments.
