## Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)

1994/0327(COD) - 05/07/1995 - Economic and Social Committee: opinion, report

The ESC welcomed the Commission proposal and endorsed its objectives of shortening the approval times. However, it called on the Commission to reduce the length of time that could elapse between submission of a request for approval to market an innovative product and the adoption of the opinion of the Scientific Committee for Food.

## Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)

1994/0327(COD) - 23/07/1996 - Commission communication on Council's position

The Commission considered that the Council's introduction of a type IIIa committee procedure for the granting of temporary authorization made a nonsense of the proposal because the facility to amend specific directives using this procedure already existed. The Commission was therefore unable to support the common position.

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 16/12/1994 - Legislative proposal

The specific directives which follow on from Directive 89/398/EEC on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses contain provisions governing the composition of the dietetic products in question. Amendments to be made to these directives, the main purpose of which is to include technological innovations, are approved in accordance with the procedure of the Standing Committee for Foodstuffs, after consultation with the Scientific Committee for Food. However, the procedure takes so long that the industries responsible for these innovations are unable to utilise the results of their research, thereby hampering their competitiveness at world level. The purpose of this proposal is to introduce a procedure granting temporary authorisation to market products based on this research, so that companies manufacturing dietetic products can take advantage of their innovations by having sufficient time to place their new products on the market ahead of the competition. Temporary marketing authorisation will be valid for a period of two years and will only be granted after consultation with the Scientific Committee for Food.

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 23/10/1996 - Text adopted by Parliament, 2nd reading

Parliament approved the common position of the Council without making any amendments.

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 18/06/1996

The Council adopted its common position. The text was to be referred to Parliament for a second reading under the codecision procedure.

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 11/10/1995 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

In adopting the report by Mr Giacomo LEOPARDI (UPE, I), the European Parliament approved the proposal on foodstuffs for particular nutritional uses with the following amendments: - the authorisation for marketing products should be temporary; - with regard to comitology: authorisation should only be granted after consultation of the Scientific Committee for Food and in accordance with the interinstitutional "modus vivendi" of 20 December 1994 relating to implementing measures for acts adopted under the codecision procedure; - the information concerning newly developed foodstuffs should remain confidential during the authorisation procedure.

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 18/06/1996 - Council position

The Council common position differs from the amended Commission proposal in that it incorporates the European Parliament amendment providing for the introduction of the type IIIa comitology procedure for the granting of temporary authorization.

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398 /EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 19/12/1996 - Final act

OBJECTIVE: to provide for a procedure allowing foodstuffs resulting from technological innovations to be placed temporarily on the market in order to utilize the results of the industry's research. COMMUNITY MEASURE: European Parliament and Council Directive 96/84/EC amending Council Directive 89/398/EEC on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses. SUBSTANCE: the directive puts in place a special procedure permitting limited authorization (for two years) for the marketing of newly developed foodstuffs for particular nutritional uses which are the result of technological innovations. The purpose is to enable firms manufacturing dietetic products to make use of their innovations by having enough time to put their new products on the market without immediately being faced with competition. Temporary marketing authorization will be given only after consultation with the Scientific Committee for Food. ENTRY INTO FORCE: 11/03/1997 DEADLINE FOR TRANSPOSITION: 30/09/1997

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398/EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 28/05/1996

The Council reached unanimous agreement on its common position. After finishing touches had been put to the text, the common position would be adopted and then referred to Parliament for a second reading under the codecision procedure.

## **Foodstuffs intended for particular nutritional uses (amend. Directive 89/398/EEC)**

1994/0327(COD) - 04/12/1995 - Modified legislative proposal

The amended proposal of the Commission accepts the amendments relating to the introduction of a new recital referring to the agreement on a 'modus vivendi' between the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission. However, the Commission did not accept the amendments concerning the introduction of the Standing Committee procedure laid down in Article 13 of Directive 89/398/EEC for the granting of the temporary authorization. Nonetheless, the Commission has amended its original proposal in order to incorporate an express reference to a consultative committee type procedure.
