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Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 31/01/1996

The Committee approves the proposed specific, limited amendments to the Annexes, insofar as they are designed to bring about greater legal certainty in respect of the implementation of the EU provisions. With a view to the three-yearly review of both the Regulation and the Directive 93/7/EEC - due to be carried out in 1996 - and in the light of the implementation reports provided for in Article 10 of the Regulation and Article 16 of the Directive, the Committee does, however, wish to take this opportunity to call upon the Commission to attach especial importance to the following: - the level of implementation of the Regulation and the Directive in the various Member States; - the advisability of introducing a form of "passport" or accompanying certificate for particular works of art; - increased cooperation between police forces and legal authorities in the field of the identification of stolen or unlawfully exported cultural goods. On a more general note, the Committee gives its backing to all endeavours to safeguard the immense heritage of cultural goods in the EU; these cultural goods are an integral part of Europe's history and its different cultures.

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 11/06/1996

The Council agreed to amend the annexes of the Directive, which was the subject of a codecision procedure with Parliament, with the German delegation voting against the proposal. The common position of the Council was to be formally adopted at a forthcoming meeting as an 'A' item.

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 08/07/1996 - Council position

In its common position, the Council made no substantive changes to the Commission proposal. It simply inserted a procedural amendment to make the date of implementation of the Directive coincide with that of the Regulation amending the Annex to Council Regulation (EEC) No 3911/92 on the export of cultural goods, the proposal for which was submitted at the same time as that for the Directive..

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 17/02/1997 - Final act

OBJECTIVE: to amend Directive 93/7/EEC on the return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State in order to deal with the problem of water-colour, gouache and pastel pictures which are regarded as being either paintings or drawings. **COMMUNITY MEASURE:** Directive 96/100/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council amending the Annex to Directive 93/7/EEC on the return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State. **SUBSTANCE:** For the purposes of Directive 93/7/EEC water-colour, gouache and pastel pictures are regarded as being either paintings or drawings, corresponding to categories 3 and 4 respectively of this Directive. Different financial thresholds apply for each of these categories which causes serious differences of treatment of the pictures depending on the Member States in which they are situated and the current national artistic traditions (which place differing values on different types of work). To deal with this problem this amendment to the directive decides specifically in which category this type of picture falls by creating a new distinct category with a threshold set at ECU 30 000. This threshold ensures that works of major significance unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State can be returned. **DEADLINE FOR TRANSPOSITION:** 17/08/1997

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 19/10/1995 - Legislative proposal

OBJECTIVE: to amend Directive 93/7/EEC on the return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State, in order to deal with the problem of water-colour, gouache and pastel pictures which are regarded as being either paintings or drawings. **SUBSTANCE:** For the purposes of Directive 93/7/EEC, water-colour, gouache and pastel pictures are regarded as being either paintings or drawings, corresponding to categories 3 and 4 respectively of this Directive. Different value thresholds apply for each of these categories, which gives rise to serious differences in the treatment of the pictures depending on the Member States in which they are situated and the current national artistic traditions (which place differing values on different types of work). To deal with this problem, the Commission proposes deciding specifically in which category this type of picture falls by creating a new distinct category with its own threshold set at ECU 30,000. This threshold will ensure that works of major significance which have been unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State can be returned.

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 21/05/1996 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

Adopting the report by Mr José Antonio ESCUDERO (PPE, E) on the return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State, the European Parliament approved the Commission proposal without amendment.

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 13/11/1996 - Text adopted by Parliament, 2nd reading

In adopting the recommendation for second reading by Mr José ESCUDERO (PPE, E), Parliament approved, without amendments, the common position of the Council amending the Annex to Directive 93/7/EEC on the return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State.

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 14/10/1996

The Council adopted the following conclusion: "The setting up of a specialized national unit to centralize all information on the illegal trafficking of works of art in each Member State of the European Union, in accordance with national law, with the aim of facilitating the exchange of information, and the analysis of that information, between the various Member States of the European Union. The aim of this proposal is to centralize the information available in the various law enforcement agencies at national level, facilitating, furthermore, the exchange of information and the analysis thereof between States through having a single contact point in each Member State of the European Union. Relations between the national unit and the relevant departments are governed by national law, in particular by constitutional rules"

Return of cultural objects unlawfully removed from the territory of a Member State

1995/0254(COD) - 16/12/1996

The Council adopted the Directive.
