## EC/Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st January 2000 to 31 December 2001

2000/0154(CNS) - 26/02/2001 - Final act

**PURPOSE** : to approve a new fishing Protocol between the Community and Guinea laying down the technical and financial conditions of fishing vessel activities off the Guinean coast for the period 01/01/2000 to 31/12/2001. **COMMUNITY MEASURE** : Council Regulation 445/2001/EC on the conclusion of the protocol setting out the fishing rights and financial contribution provided for in the Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Government of the Republic of Guinea on fishing off the Guinean coast for the period 01/01/2000 to 31/12/2001. **CONTENT** : this Protocol supplies fishing licences for 38 tuna seiners, 14 pole-and-line tuna vessels and 16 surface long-liners and for an equivalent of 2 500 GRT/month on an annual basis for fin-fish/cephalopods and 1 500 GRT/month for shrimps. If need be, and the case where the fishing resources allow it, the Joint Agreement Committee shall authorise the introduction of new fishing categories. The Regulation stipulates that financial compensation of EUR 1 600 000 per year shall be provided. If the catches exceed the this quota, the Community shall increase its financial compensation proportionally. With regard to the financial compensation, the Community shall participate in the financing of various measures in the field of fishing for a total amount of EUR 1 360 000 per year. These measures include scientific and technical programmes to improve knowledge of fishery and biological resources in Guinea's fishing zone, support for fisheries surveillance bodies, aid for non-industrial fishing and institutional aid for the Fisheries Ministry. With regard to the financial compensation, the government of Guinea has full discretion regarding the use to which financial compensation is put. In addition, Guinea undertakes to implement a plan to reduce its overall fishing effort. The Community undertakes to pay a financial contribution to the costs incurred in the management and monitoring required to implement that reduction, not exceeding EUR 370 000 per year, provided that the conditions agreed are jointly met. Lastly, the Regulation states that the fishing rights shall be allocated among the following Member States : France, Spain, Greece, Portugal and Italy. If licence applications from those Member States do not exhaust the fishing rights set out in the Protocol, the Commission may consider licence applications from any other Member State. **ENTRY INTO FORCE** : The regulation shall enter into force on 9 March 2001. The Protocol shall enter into force as soon as all the parties have been notified of the necessary procedures to this effect.

## EC/Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st January 2000 to 31 December 2001

2000/0154(CNS) - 06/09/2000 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

In approving the report drafted by Mr Daniel VARELA SUANZES-CARPEGNA (EPP/ED, E), the European Parliament adopted, under consultation procedure, the proposal for a Council regulation relating to the conclusion of the Protocol establishing the fishing possibilities and the financial compensation provided for in the Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Government of the Republic of Guinea on fishing off the Guinean coast for the period 01.01.2000 to 31.12.2001. However, although this text was adopted, it was subject to a few amendments which relate in particular to: - the submission of a general assessment report from the Commission to the European Parliament and the Council; - the forwarding of an annual report on the implementation of targeted measures which the Guinean authorities are to send to it on the basis of the fourth paragraph of Article 4 of the Protocol. Lastly, on the basis of those reports and taking account of the European Parliament's opinion, the Council shall give the Commission a mandate, where appropriate, to commence negotiations with a view to the adoption of a new protocol.

## EC/Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st January 2000 to 31 December 2001

2000/0154(CNS) - 09/06/2000 - Legislative proposal

**PURPOSE** : to adopt the conclusion of the new Protocol to the Fisheries Agreement between the European Community and Guinea for the period 1 January 2000 to 31 December 2001. **CONTENT** : The new Protocol setting out the fishing rights and the financial contribution provided for was initialled on 17 December 1999. The fishing rights set out in the Protocol relate to fin-fish/cephalopods, shrimps, tuna seiners, pole and line tuna vessels and surface longliners, and are allocated as between Spain, Italy, Greece, Portugal and France. If licence applications between those Member States do not exhaust the fishing rights set out in the Protocol, the Commission may consider licence applications from other Member States. The financial compensation is fixed at EUR 2 960 000 per year (EUR 1 600 000 as financial compensation and EUR 1 360 000 for other measures provided for in the Protocol. These measures include scientific and technical programmes to improve knowledge of fishery and biological resources in Guinea's fishing zone, support for fisheries surveillance bodies, aid for non-industrial fishing and institutional aid for the Fisheries Ministry. With regard o the

financial compensation, the government of Guinea has full discretion regarding the use to which financial compensation is put. In addition, Guinea undertakes to implement a plan to reduce its overall fishing effort. The Community undertakes to pay a financial contribution to the costs incurred in the management and monitoring required to implement that reduction, not exceeding EUR 370 000 per year, provided that the conditions agreed are jointly met.
