## Guidelines for trans-European networks for the electronic interchange of data between administrations (IDA)

2001/0210(COD) - 21/10/2002 - Final act

**PURPOSE** : to amend Decision 1719/1999/EC on a series of guidelines, including the identification of projects of common interest, for trans-European networks for the electronic interchange of data between administrations. **COMMUNITY MEASURE** : Decision 2046/2002/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council. **CONTENT** : to recall, the second phase of the IDA programme was adopted by the European Parliament and the Council in their Decisions 1719/1999/EC (Guidelines decision) and 1720/1999/EC (Interoperability decision) of 12 July 1999. Article 9 and 13 respectively of the two decisions require the Commission to submit a first evaluation of the IDA II Programme to the European Parliament and the Council no later than the draft budget for the year 2001, together with any proposal for the amendment of the Annex of the Guidelines decision and any appropriate proposal for the amendment of the Interoperability decision. The general objective of Decision 1719/1999/EC is for the Community, in co-operation with the Member States, to take necessary measures to establish operational, interoperable, trans-European telematic networks between Member State administrations and the Community institutions, enabling the efficient, effective and secure interchange of information in order to support the establishment of economic and monetary union and the implementation of Community policies, as well as the Community decision-making process. More specifically, the objective of the Decision is to fulfil the requirement laid down in Article 9 of decision 1719/1999/EC to submit a first evaluation of the implementation of that decision to the European Parliament and the Council, together with any appropriate proposal for the amendment of the Annex of that decision. It should be noted, however, that the Proposal to amend decision 1719/1999/EC also includes amendments to a number of articles of that decision, taking into account the evaluation results, as well as the first one-and-a-half year of experience in implementing the decision and the context provided by the e-Europe initiative and related action plan. For the proposal to amend Decision 1719/1999/EC, three types of amendments can be distinguished: 1) changes in legal and political obligations and adaptation of the committee procedure in accordance with Council Decision 1999/468/EC and extension of the IDA II programme to Malta and Turkey, as well as providing the possibility for candidate countries and non-member countries to use, at their own costs and under certain conditions, IDA generic services; 2) improvement of some practical conditions and introduction of a financial reference for the period 2002-2004 which is set at EUR 39.8 million; 3) the need to extend the areas where new telematic networks can be established, in particular to include networks in the field of education and judicial affairs. As regards the Committee, the Commission shall be assisted by a committee called the Telematics between Administrations Committee (TAC) composed of representatives of the Member States chaired by the representatives of the Member States and chaired by the representative of the Commission. **ENTRY INTO FORCE** : 20 November 2002.

## **Guidelines for trans-European networks for the electronic interchange of data between administrations (IDA)**

2001/0210(COD) - 11/06/2002 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

Using its procedure without debate, the European Parliament adopted a resolution drafted by Mel READ (PES, UK) on guidelines for the electronic interchange of data between administrations (IDA). (Please refer to the document dated 22/05/02.) Parliament stated that, in planning and implementing new networks, it is essential to ensure close cooperation between Member States and the Commission and other Community institutions.

## **Guidelines for trans-European networks for the electronic interchange of data between administrations (IDA)**

2001/0210(COD) - 25/03/2002

The Council agreed on a general approach, pending the Opinion of the European Parliament, on the updating of the second phase of the programme, under way since 1999, to promote the establishment and use of trans-European networks for the electronic interchange of data between administrations (IDA). The Council instructed the Presidency to forward this approach informally to the Parliament with a view to reaching an agreement at the first reading if possible. The Council's approach concerns two proposals designed to amend: - Decision 1719/1999/EC on a series of guidelines, including the identification of projects of common interest, for IDA networks; - Decision 1720/1999/EC adopting a series of actions and measures in order to ensure interoperability of and access to IDA networks. The aim of the programme is to facilitate the interchange of data in order, inter alia, to support the implementation of Community policies. The amendments concern: - adapting the committee procedure to the new rules on the subject (introduced by Decision 1999/468/EC); - extending the programme to certain non-Community countries; - introducing a financial reference for the period 2002-2004, namely EUR 39,8 million for the "guidelines" Decision and EUR 34,2 million for the "interoperability" Decision; - taking account of new initiatives such as the eEurope Action Plan.
