EC/Angola fisheries agreement: extension of the protocol for the period from 3 May 2002 to 2 August 2002

2002/0148(CNS) - 22/10/2002 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

The European Parliament adopted a resolution based on the report by Struan STEVENSON (EPP-ED, UK) and approved the conclusion of the Agreement.

COMMUNITY MEASURE : Decision 913/2002/EC on the signing, on behalf of the European Community, and provisional application of the Agreement in the form of an Exchange of Letters on the extension of the Protocol setting out the fishing rights and the financial contribution provided for by the Agreement between the Community and Angola on fishing off Angola for the period 3 May to 2 August 2002. CONTENT : This Decision approves the signing of the above Agreement, the text of which is attached to the decision. The Agreement will be applied on a provisional basis by the Community from 3 May 2002.

EC/Angola fisheries agreement: extension of the protocol for the period from 3 May 2002 to 2 August 2002

2002/0148(CNS) - 09/07/2002 - Legislative proposal

PURPOSE : to extend the Protocol on fishing opportunities between Angola and the EC. CONTENT : The Protocol to the Fisheries Agreement between the EC and Angola expired on 2 May 2002. Pending the conclusions on the negotiations on the amendments to be made to the Protocol to the Fisheries Agreement, the two parties have decided to extend the expired Protocol for a further three months. The extension of the Protocol was initialled by both parties on 26 April 2002 and sets out the technical and financial conditions governing the fishing activities of Community vessels in Angolan waters during the period from 3 May to 2 August 2002. The Commission proposes that the Council adopt this extension of the Protocol. A proposal for a Council Decision on the provisional application of the extension pending its definitive entry into force is the subject of a separate procedure.

PURPOSE : to extend the Protocol on fishing opportunities between Angola and the EC. COMMUNITY MEASURE : Council Regulation 2057/2002/EC on the conclusion of the Agreement in the form of an Exchange of Letters on the extension of the Protocol setting out the fishing rights and the financial contribution provided for by the Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Republic of Angola on fishing off the Angolan coast for the period from 3 May to 2 August 2002. CONTENT : the Agreement is approved and the text is attached to this Regulation. The fishing rights established pro rata temporis are allocated among the Member States as follows: -shrimp vessels: Spain: 6550 GRT per month, averaged over the year, 22 vessels -demersal fishing vessels: Spain: 1650 GRT per month averaged over the year Portugal: 1000 GRT per month, averaged over the year Italy: 650 GRT per month, averaged over the year Greece: 450 GRT per month, averaged over the year -freezer tuna seiners: France: 7 vessels

Spain: 11 vessels -surface longliners: Portugal: 5 vessels Spain: 20 vessels -pelagic fishing vessels: Ireland: 2 vessels If licence applications from these Member States do not cover all the fishing rights fixed by the Protocol, the Commission may consider licence applications from any other Member State. ENTRY INTO FORCE : 24/11/02.
