Europol: staff regulations, amendments. Initiative Denmark

2002/0822(CNS) - 05/06/2003 - Final act

PURPOSE : to amend the Staff Regulation applicable to Europol employees. **COMMUNITY MEASURE** : Council Act amending the Staff Regulations applicable to Europol employees. **CONTENT** : the Council adopted, based n the Danish initiative, an Act amending the Staff Regulations applicable to Europol employees. These measures, adopted unanimously, lay down detailed arrangements applicable to Europol employees. They concern in

particular obligations; working conditions; emoluments and family allowances; the rules relating to the reimbursement of expenses; social security benefits; education allowance for officials returning to the Hague (Europol's headquarters) from a transfer in a third country. All of these measures are considered special and exceptional to officials of Europol serving in a third country. ENTRY INTO FORCE : 6 June 2003.

The European Parliament adopted a resolution drafted by Maurizio TURCO (Ind, Italy) rejecting the Danish initiative on Europol's Staff Regulations.

2002/0822(CNS) - 11/11/2002 - Legislative proposal

PURPOSE : to propose the initiative of Denmark with a view to adopting a Council Act amending the Staff Regulation applicable to Europol employees.

CONTENT : it is desirable to amend the Staff Regulations applicable to Europol employees (the Staff Regulations), as laid down in Council Act of 3 December 1998, in particular in order to establish special provisions for Europol officials serving in third countries, on account of special living conditions there. It is for the Council, acting unanimously, to lay down detailed arrangements applicable to Europol employees. These arrangements concern in particular obligations; working conditions; emoluments and family allowances; the rules relating to the reimbursement of expenses; social security benefits; education allowance for officials returning from a transfer in a third country. All of these measures are considered special and exceptional to officials of Europol serving in a third country.
