Water management: quality required of shellfish waters (repeal. Directive 79/923/EEC). Codification

2006/0067(COD) - 12/12/2006 - Final act

PURPOSE: to codify Directive 79/923/EEC.

LEGISLATIVE ACT: Directive 2006/113/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council on the quality required of shellfish waters (codified version).

CONTENT: the purpose of this Regulation is to codify EU provisions on the quality of shellfish waters. It applies to those coastal and brackish waters in need of protection in order to support shellfish. In codifying legislative acts that have been amended frequently the EU is seeking to both simplify and clarify EU legislation.

The new Directive supersedes the various acts incorporated in it. It fully preserves the content of the acts being codified and hence does no more than bring them together, with only such formal amendments as are required by the codification exercise itself.

ENTRY INTO FORCE: 16 January 2007.

2006/0067(COD) - 12/10/2006 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

The European Parliament adopted the resolution drafted by Giuseppe **GARGANI** (EPP-ED, IT), and approved the codified version of the proposed directive on the quality required of shellfish waters.

2006/0067(COD) - 12/05/2006 - Legislative proposal

PURPOSE: to codify Directive 79/923/EEC on the quality required of shellfish in waters.

PROPOSED ACT: Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council.

CONTENT: In accordance with the EU's policy to simplify legislation the European Commission is proposing a codification of Directive 79/923/EEC and its subsequent amendments into a single text. The new Directive will supersede the various acts incorporated in it. This proposal fully preserves the content of the acts being codified and hence does no more than bring them together with only such formal amendments as are required by the codification exercise itself. Where the Articles have been given new numbers, the correlation between the old and the new numbers is shown in a table contained in Annex III to the codified Directive.
