Economic statistics: statistical classification of products by activity CPA (repeal. Regulation (EEC) No 3696/93)

2006/0218(COD) - 23/04/2008 - Final act

PURPOSE: to establish a new statistical classification of products by activity (CPA) within the Community.

LEGISLATIVE ACT: Regulation (EC) No 451/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing a new statistical classification of products by activity (CPA) and repealing Council Regulation (EEC) No 3696/93.

CONTENT: this Regulation establishes a new common CPA within the Community in order to ensure relevance with respect to the economic reality and comparability between national, Community and international classifications and hence national, Community and international statistics.

The CPA was established in 1993 for the harmonisation of economic statistics. The revised version reflects technological development and structural changes in the economy since then.

The regulation repeals Regulation (EEC) No 3696/93.

ENTRY INTO FORCE: 24/06/2008.

APPLICATION: from 01/01/2008.

Economic statistics: statistical classification of products by activity CPA (repeal. Regulation (EEC) No 3696/93)

PURPOSE: to establish a new statistical classification of products by activity (CPA). To repeal Council Regulation 3696/93/EEC.

PROPOSED ACT: Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council.

CONTENT: the statistical classification of "products by activity" is currently set out in Regulation 3696/93/EEC. This form of classification is known as the "common statistical classification of products by activity" or CPA and is closely linked to the NACE statistical classification of economic activities. The Commission is proposing a revision of the CPA statistical classification system.

Revising the CPA has been prompted by important changes to the economy since 1993. In addition there have been major revisions to international classifications of activities and products. The revised CPA will, thus, take account of economic changes as well as international improvements.

The proposal has no implications for the Community budget.

Economic statistics: statistical classification of products by activity CPA (repeal. Regulation (EEC) No 3696/93)

2006/0218(COD) - 10/07/2007 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

The European Parliament adopted the resolution by Guntars **KRASTS** (UEN, LV) on the Commission proposal aiming to establish a new statistical classification of products by activity (CPA) and repealing Council Regulation (EEC) N° 3696/93.

The amendments which are of a purely technical nature are in line with the modifications of the Eurostat Task Force and the Working Party.

The main amendment concerns the comitology procedure. The Commission should be empowered to amend the CPA in order to take account of technological or economic developments and align it with other economic and social classifications. Since those measures are of general scope and are designed to amend non-essential elements of this Regulation or supplement it by the addition of new non-essential elements, they should be adopted in accordance with the regulatory procedure with scrutiny.
