According to the [draft protocol](#) on the application of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU to the Czech Republic (which aims to add this country to the Protocol on the extension of the Charter of Fundamental Rights), this proposal aims **not to convene a Convention** to consider the proposal to extend to the Czech Republic Protocol 30 on the implementation of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union to Poland and the United Kingdom.

The Committee on Constitutional Affairs adopted the report by Andrew DUFF (ALDE, UK) in which it recommends the European Parliament to approve the European Council's proposal **not to convene a Convention** in order to examine the proposal that Protocol No 30 on the application of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union to Poland and to the United Kingdom be extended to the Czech Republic. It considers that the effect of that proposal, if any, would be limited.

2011/0818(NLE) - 22/05/2013 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

The European Parliament decided by 631 votes to 25, with 23 abstentions, to approve the European Council's proposal **not to convene a Convention** to examine the proposal that Protocol No 30 on the application of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union to Poland and to the United Kingdom be extended to the Czech Republic, as the effect of that proposal, if any, would be limited.
