2012/0274(NLE) - 09/10/2012

PURPOSE: the conclusion of the Cooperation Agreement on a civil Global Navigation Satellite System between the European Community and its Member States and Ukraine.

PROPOSED ACT: Council Decision.

BACKGROUND: Ukraine is one of the eight countries with significant technological knowhow important in satellite navigation equipment, applications and regional technology.

The Ukrainian space industry is among the world's leaders in the design and production of launchers and critical Global Navigation Satellite Systems (GNSS) components.

Since 2000 Ukraine has shown interest in European GNSS projects and has developed its own contribution to the regional EGNOS System Test Bed, precursor of Galileo. Since 2010 discussions are on going to extend the EGNOS coverage to Ukrainian territory. The EGNOS coverage of Ukraine will increase the integrity of EGNOS in Eastern Poland, Romania and Bulgaria.

On 7 October 2003 the EU-Ukraine summit adopted the Ukraine - EU Joint Statement on Cooperation in Satellite Navigation. The Council authorised the Commission on 8 October 2004 to open negotiations with Ukraine for the conclusion of a Cooperation Agreement on a Civil Global Navigation Satellite System.

LEGAL BASIS: Articles 172 in conjunction with 218(6)(a) of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union.

CONTENT: this proposal aims to approve, on behalf of the EU, the Cooperation Agreement on a Civil Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) between the European Community and its Member States, of the one part, and Ukraine of the other part.

This Agreement will allow for:

- closer cooperation with Ukraine in the area of satellite navigation;
- implementing a number of elements of the European satellite navigation programmes.
- **the EGNOS extension to Ukraine** and the collaboration in areas such standardisation, certification, radio spectrum, industrial cooperation and trade and market development.

Territorial provisions: Bulgaria and Romania are to become parties to the agreement by the conclusion of a protocol in accordance with Art 6(2) of the Act concerning the conditions of accession of the Republic of Bulgaria and Romania and the adjustments to the treaties on which the European Union is founded.

BUDGETARY IMPLICATIONS: unspecified.

2012/0274(NLE) - 04/03/2013 - Legislative proposal

PURPOSE: the conclusion of the Cooperation Agreement on a Civil Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) between the European Community and its Member States and Ukraine.

PROPOSED ACT: Council Decision.

ROLE OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT: the Council may adopt the act only if the European Parliament has given its consent.

BACKGROUND: on 8 October 2004, the Council authorised the Commission to open negotiations with Ukraine for a Cooperation Agreement on a Civil Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS).

In accordance with the Decision of the Council of 15 November 2005, the Agreement was signed on 1 December 2005. It allows for closer cooperation with Ukraine in the area of satellite navigation. It will implement a number of elements of the European satellite navigation programmes.

The Agreement should now be approved on behalf of the European Union.

LEGAL BASIS: Article 172 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU), in conjunction with Article 218(6)(a) thereof.

CONTENT: this Council proposal, proposes the approval on behalf of the European Union, the Cooperation Agreement on a Civil Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) between the European Community and its Member States and Ukraine

Purpose of the agreement: the agreement will allow for:

- closer cooperation with Ukraine in the area of satellite navigation;
- implementing a number of elements of the European satellite navigation programmes ;
- the **EGNOS extension to Ukraine** and the collaboration in areas such standardisation, certification, radio spectrum, industrial cooperation and trade and market development.

ENTRY INTO FORCE: 25.11.2013. The date of entry into force of the agreement will be published in the *Official Journal of the European Union* by the Secretariat of the Council.
