## Common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products; approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles: certain reporting requirements

The European Parliament adopted by 585 votes to 9, with 7 abstentions, a legislative resolution on the proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EU) No 1379/2013, Regulation (EU) No 167/2013 and Regulation (EU) No 168/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards certain reporting requirements.

Parliament adopted its position at first reading taking over the Commission proposal.

Regulation (EU) No 1379/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products, Regulation (EU) No 167/2013 on the approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and Regulation (EU) No 168/2013 on the approval and market surveillance of two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles contain a number of reporting requirements in the fields of marketing standards and market surveillance.

This proposal concerns limited and targeted amendments to the legislation with a view to simplifying the reporting requirements. These changes are based on the experience gained from the implementation of the legislation.

The Committee on the Internal Market and Consumer Protection adopted the report by Anna CAVAZZINI (Greens/EFA/ALE, DE) on the proposal for a regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EU) No 1379/2013, Regulation (EU) No 167/2013 and Regulation (EU) No 168/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards certain reporting requirements.

The committee responsible recommended that the European Parliament's position adopted at first reading under the ordinary legislative procedure should amend the proposal as follows:

Regulation (EU) No 1379/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products, Regulation (EU) No 167/2013 on the approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and Regulation (EU) No 168/2013 on the approval and market surveillance of two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles contain a number of reporting requirements in the fields of marketing standards and market surveillance.

## **Common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products; approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles: certain reporting requirements**

2023/0370(COD) - 17/10/2023 - Legislative proposal

PURPOSE: to rationalise reporting requirements.

PROPOSED ACT: Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council.

ROLE OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT: the European Parliament decides in accordance with the ordinary legislative procedure and on an equal footing with the Council.

BACKGROUND: reporting requirements play a key role in ensuring proper monitoring and correct enforcement of legislation. Reporting requirements can however also impose disproportionate burdens on stakeholders, particularly affecting SMEs and micro-companies, also given organisational and technological developments that call for original reporting requirements to be adjusted.

Streamlining reporting obligations and reducing the administrative burden are therefore a priority.

**Regulation (EU) No 1379/2013** of the European Parliament and of the Council provides that rules establishing common marketing standards, **Regulation (EU) No 167/2013** sets out the rules on the approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and **Regulation (EU) No 168/2013** sets out the rules on the approval and market surveillance of two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles, contain a number of reporting requirements in the fields of marketing standards and market surveillance which should be simplified.

In line with the Commission's Communication on '[Long-term competitiveness of the EU: looking beyond 2030](#)', this proposal is part of a first package of measures to rationalise reporting requirements. This is a step in a process looking comprehensively at existing reporting requirements, with a view to assess their continued relevance and to make them more efficient.

CONTENT: this proposal concerns **limited and targeted amendments to the legislation with a view to rationalising reporting requirements**. These changes are based on experience from implementing the legislation.

The proposal aims to simplify initiatives included in headline ambition 'A European Green Deal' in the policy area of the common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products and affecting the fishing industry. It will also simplify and eliminate certain reporting obligations in the area of the approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles.

By streamlining certain information obligations, the proposal will make it possible to achieve the objectives of the legislation in a more efficient and less burdensome manner for businesses and public authorities.

## **Common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products; approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles: certain reporting requirements**

2023/0370(COD) - 07/11/2024 - Final act

PURPOSE: to streamline certain reporting requirements provided for in Regulations (EU) 2024/2838, (EU) No 1379/2013, (EU) No 167/2013 and (EU) No 168/2013.

LEGISLATIVE ACT: Regulation (EU) 2024/2838 of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulations (EU) No 1379/2013, (EU) No 167/2013 and (EU) No 168/2013 as regards certain reporting requirements;

CONTENT: reporting requirements play a key role in ensuring proper monitoring and correct enforcement of Union legal acts. However, it is important to streamline such requirements to ensure that they fulfil the purpose for which they were intended and to limit the administrative burden.

Regulation (EU) No 1379/2013 on the common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products, Regulation (EU) No 167/2013 on the approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles and Regulation (EU) No 168/2013 on the approval and market, surveillance of two- or three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles contain a number of reporting requirements in the fields of marketing standards and market surveillance. In line with the Commission's Communication of 16 March 2023 entitled 'Long-term competitiveness of the EU: looking beyond 2030', this regulation **removes and simplifies** reporting requirements which are no longer deemed necessary in the area of the common organisation of the markets in fishery and aquaculture products and affecting the fishing industry and in the area of type-approval and market surveillance of agricultural and forestry vehicles, two- and three-wheel vehicles and quadricycles.
